unto the Populace of the Barony of Oldenfeld and all who see these words, do we, Miklos and Marie offer greetings in these fell days of long nights and War.

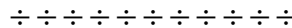
The borderlands are on fire and War is upon us! Having led a successful top secret diplomatic mission to our Meridian allies to the north, preparations are being made for the western campaign to come!

the home fires burning, the quiet time is great for projects and planning for upcoming events.

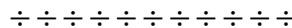

cius Verus, an unprecedented political arrangement in the Roman Empire.

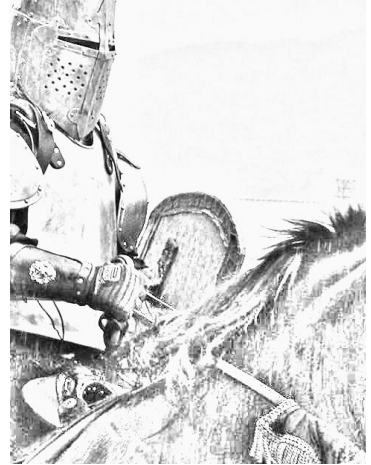
321 - Roman Emperor Constantine I decrees that the dies Solis Invicti (sun-day) is the day of rest in the Empire.
