Idenfeld's annual Curia was held on June 22, 2013. The full agenda covered period accessories, coronets, officer positions, business meeting

decorum, baronial budget and storage options, guilds, and demos. Full meeting minutes can be obtained from the Historian, <u>Daedra Forbes</u>, and some major discussion items are included below.

Period Accessories

The populace of Oldenfeld has done a commendable job in acquiring period tents, making our encampment at Gulf Wars one of the best. However, we can do much more when it comes to chairs and accessories. Camp chairs are cheap and easy to tote to events, but it would be great to have period chairs, or even so-called Viking or boy scout chairs (not medieval, but passable!). Count Ardien and HL William Ulf are willing to assist the populace in the construction of chairs, tables, and other camp/ event accessories, and materials can often be purchased for about the same cost as a decent camp chair. Work days and classes are both an option for those who are interested.

The immersive experience makes the dream a little more real, and we would like to help our newcomers feel the same thing for their first feast. Cooks' Corner

Recipe taken from <u>II Liber de Coquina:</u>
An Anonymous Cookbook from the Angevin Court, early 14th Century, translated and redacted by The Upper Crust Cooking Guild of the Barony of Gyldenhold, Kingdom of Caid

This recipe was used as the filling for pies served at the feast commemorating the Investiture of Miklos and Marie, Third Baron and Baroness of the Barony of Oldenfeld. This recipe can also be used as a side dish, or thinned a bit and used as a sauce for meat. If meat is cooked, chopped and added to the Mortarolo, it makes a good one-dish meal. Truly a versatile recipe with great flavor. (Note: The kitchen staff at Investiture didn't get to try this one; no leftovers returned to the kitchen.)

De Mortarolo

Mortar

- 1 tablespoon pepper
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice
- 2 cups onions, thinly sliced
- 2 tablespoons lard
- 1/4 cup chardonnay mixed with 1/2 cup
- 1 pound bacon, cooked well and crumbled
- 1 pinch saffron threads
- ½ cup dry breadcrumbs
- 2 egg yolks, well beaten Sugar

Mix all the spices together except saffron and set aside. Place the saffron in 2 tablespoons hot water and allow to steep. Cook the onions in the lard until opaque. Add the wine mixture and the bacon to the onions. Bring to a boil. Add 2 teaspoons of the spice mixture, the saffron water, and the bread. Simmer until the bread "dissolves". Add the egg yolk; mix well. Simmer until heated through. Before serving, sprinkle with the remaining spice and sugar.

Notes: This recipe is very versatile. It works well on its own, as a side dish, as a sauce, or in a pie. As a pie, it can be served hot or cold and fits into any meal of the day (including breakfast).
