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YULE, PAST AND PRESENT

king of Norway, is credited with the first attempt at the Christianization of Norway, which he did principally by linking the pagan midwinter celebration of Yule and the Christian holiday of Christmas. As told in the Heimskringla, the royal dynasty of Norway written in Old Norse by poet and historian Snorri Sturluson circa 1230, King Haakon I was a popular, successful ruler and was also known as Haakon the Good (Hákon góði in Old Norse). At a very young age, Haakon was sent by his father, King Harald I, to the court of King Athelstan of England, to be fostered by King Athelstan and kept out of harm's way. The English king raised him in the Christian religion of Roman Catholicism. When news of his father's death and half-brother Eirik the Bloodaxe's ascension to the throne reached England in c. 932-933, King Athelstan sent Haakon home with ships and men to take the throne. Haakon gained the support of landowners by promising to overturn taxes levied by his father, and Eirik the Bloodaxe was forced to flee the country with his family soon after.

King Haakon hid his Christianity at first to retain the support of the chieftans of the heathen land, but he was successful in rescheduling Yule to coincide with the Christian celebration of Christmas by imposing fines for failure to comply. Traditionally, Yule was celebrated in a heathen temple for three nights, and it involved livestock sacrifices, blood ceremonies, and the consumption of great amounts of food and ale. The sacrificial blood (hlaut) was collected in a vessel (hlautteinar), borne around the fire, and blessed by the man who made the feast. The blood was then smeared on the idols and walls of the temple, and sprinkled on all present. The meat of the animals was blessed, boiled, and served at the feast. Toasts were drunk first to Odin. second to the gods Njörðr and Freyr, and third to the king. Memorial toasts (minni) were also made to departed kinsfolk. However, King Haakon's popularity was such that, over time, many stopped

making sacrifices and even allowed themselves to be baptized. According to the saga of Haakon in the Heimskringla, Haakon eventually requested clergy from England "to have the gospel preached in the whole country," but his efforts were so unsuccessful that even his own court poet memorialized Haakon's passing by writing of the gods welcoming him into Valhalla. In modern societies, a number of the pagan Yule traditions persist. Although the origins are unclear, the Yule log is frequently associated with Germanic paganism and most likely was an entire large tree, carefully selected to provide warmth and endurance through the entire threeday celebration of Yule. The symbolic log was thought to bring prosperity and provide protection from evil spirits. Today, the Yule log is frequently represented in European countries by a chocolate sponge cake, decorated to resemble a log. The Yule boar, or sónargoltr, was sacrificed during the traditional Germanic pagan celebration of Yule; this was likely in the name of Freyr, whose mount is a gold-bristled boar. During the ceremony, solemn oaths to the king were sworn on the bristles of the sacrificial boar on Yule Eve. In modern Germany and Scandinavian countries, the tradition persists in the marzipan pig, which is given as a gift at Christmas or the New Year to bestow good luck and fortune in the coming year. The same tradition is also represented in modern times by the Christmas ham. The feast day of Saint Stephen (December 26) is also thought to represent another attempt to relate Yule traditions to Christmas and Christianity; late medieval Swedish art depicts St. Stephen bringing a boar's head to the Yuletide banquet, in what historians believe was an attempt to replace pagan rituals dedicated to Freyr with celebration of a Christian saint.
