Wynter wakeneth al my care

Anonymous circa 1300 MS Harl. 2253. F. 49r

Loosely translated by Michael R. Burch

*Wynter wakeneth al my care,
Nou this leves waxeth bare.
Ofte y sike ant mourne sare
When hit cometh in my thoht
Of this worldes joie, hou hit goth al to noht.*

Translation

*Winter awakens all my care
as leafless trees grow bare.
For now my sighs are fraught
whenever it enters my thought:
regarding this world's joy,
how everything comes to naught.*



“Wynter wakeneth al my care” is one of the earliest surviving winter poems in English literature and an early rhyming poem as well. Edward Bliss Reed dated the poem to around 1310, around 30 years before the birth of Geoffrey Chaucer, and said it was thought to have been composed in Leominster, Herefordshire.

This quarter's recipe is from Le Menagier de Paris

Pour Faire Une Tourte



POUR FAIRE UNE TOURTE, prenez quatre poignées de bettes, deux poignées de percil, une poignée de cerfueil, un brain de fanoil et deux poignées d'espinoches, et les eslisez et lavez en eau froide, puis hachiez bien menu: puis broyez de deux paires de frommages, c'est assavoir du mol et du moiēn, et puis mettez des oeufs avec ce, moyeu et aubun, et les broyez parmi le frommage; puis mettez les herbes dedans le mortier et broyez tout ensemble, et aussi mettez-y de la poudre fine...

Translation

TO MAKE A TART, take four handfuls of beet-leaves, two handfuls of parsley, one handful of chervil, a bit of fennel and two handfuls of cleavers, and clean them and wash them in cold water, then chop very small: then pound two kinds of cheese, that is one soft and one medium, and then put eggs with it, yolk and white, and pound them in with the cheese; then put the herbs in the mortar and grind them up together, and also add to that some fine powder...

Ingredients:

4 handfuls of beet greens or chard
2 handfuls of parsley
1 handful of chervil
1 sprig of fennel
2 handfuls of baby spinach (since cleavers are not available, but based on research appear to have had a mild tender taste)
6 eggs
1 cup Brie or Neufchatel or go crazy and use a French blue cheese! (see notes below)
1 cup Comte or Gruyere, grated
1 tsp Poudre Fine** (see notes below)
1 Pie Crust *** (optional, see notes below)

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°F

Wash all your greens and chop them finely.

Add your cheese to a separate bowl and mix, then beat in 6 eggs

Add your washed and chopped greens and fine powder and mix well.

Pour into pie crust and bake at 350°F until firm - about an hour.

NOTES

*The recipe calls for one soft and one medium cheese, which leaves a lot to interpretation. Medieval cheeses were more often than not categorized as fresh or pressed or by the region or aging time. Soft referred to just that, a fresh soft cheese, medium would be a semi hard or “pressed” cheese. Many translations simply sub mozzarella and parmesan. I think that is a cop out and boring. There are many more appropriate and tastier cheeses to use as I have listed above. The soft cheese they mention might have been rowen or ruayn, a semi-soft cheese that was firmer than brie and thus able to be grated. It is most likely the grating part that leads people to choose mozzarella as a substitute.

**Fine Powder or Poudre Fine refers to a spice blend that was prevalent during the Middle Ages. It is a blend of cinnamon, clove, and ginger. Some common additions would have been pepper, saffron or nutmeg, and occasionally grains of paradise, coriander, galangal, long pepper, mace, nutmeg, bay leaf, or sugar.

***You'll notice the recipe does not mention putting the mixture into a pie crust. The recipe IS for a tart, but crustless tarts were a thing in the Middle Ages, so if you're trying to go gluten free, you could easily make this a crustless tart and it would be just as delicious.

Enjoy! And if you make the recipe, be sure to let Mistress Philomena how it turned out!

The name Eua was mentioned in the Book of Deer, a 10th century illustrated manuscript produced at Deer Abbey in Scotland. Later I decided to move towards a more English persona, but didn't want to change my first name, so I looked in a historical atlas for a town that would have been present on the border of Scotland and England in the 12th century. The town of Newcastle fit the bill, and since I was a big fan of the beer of the same name it felt like a perfect fit.

Is there a back story for your persona? – Not much of one, really. I settled on 12th century England as my period and place mainly because I fell in love with wearing bliauts!

Favorite SCA activities – While I really miss armored combat, I do love practicing the fiber arts such as spinning and weaving, as well as helping run events.

Favorite mundane activities – More fiber arts, lol! Knitting, spinning, sewing, weaving. But also computer games, and meeting friends at Lofty Pursuits for ice cream!

Constable

The Constable's duty is to safeguard the welfare of people who attend Oldenfeld events.

Note, that officers of the Constabulary do not have the authority to enforce state/local law; they uphold the law by way of observation, limited intervention, and proper use of the chain of command for Oldenfeld officers.

Constables have no greater legal authority than any normal member of the public.

In Oldenfeld, our Constable also works to maintain and keep organized our storage unit.

Herald

The Herald is the officer responsible for maintaining and promoting heraldic activities in Oldenfeld, including registration of Baronial Awards and other heraldry, assisting members of Oldenfeld with their name, device and badge design and registration, providing voice heraldry to the Baron and Baroness, monthly office reports, and assuring proper site heraldry at Oldenfeld events.

The Herald is a warranted officer, subject to approval and requirements of the Trimaris Triskele Principal Herald

Heavy Weapons Marshal

The Heavy Weapons Marshal is tasked with organizing and supervising the safe, rule-abiding practice of heavy combat. They will also help people get authorized to fight.

The Heavy Weapons Marshal is a *warranted* officer.

This means that they must be approved by a kingdom (state)-level officer of the same type.

In this case, they must be approved by the **Trimaris Earl Marshal**.
